The winner will be announced at the Ahuwhenua Trophy awards dinner in Tauranga on Friday 22nd May 2020.

This whakatauki was first written by Sir Apirana Ngata (Ngāti Porou) in a young woman's autograph book in 1949. Her name was Rangī Bennett and he wrote it to encourage her in her education and to achieve the highest ideals of life. Ngata believed Māori advancement would benefit by reapplying learnings from Te Ao Pākehā (the Pākehā world) to Te Ao Māori (the Māori world), ideally resulting in a positive effect on both cultures.
